LinkedIn – Both a personal branding & networking tool



- Powerful platform for networking
- Used heavily in the corporate world
- Can post/share updates/thoughts
- Can link to publications, other media
- Can self-author articles on the platform

Overview of a few core LinkedIn features

Settings & Privacy: Visibility of your profile & network

- Profile viewing options:
- *Choose whether you're visible of viewing in private mode*

Editing your public profile & URL

- Edit your custom URL
- *Personalize the URL for your profile.*
- linkedin.com/in/XXX

Open to work feature

Let recruiters know you are open to work

LinkedIn Headline – Limited to 120 characters

- By default, LinkedIn creates your headline based on your current job title and company. For example: “Web Developer at Jobscan.”
- BUT, you need to stand out and convey your future value in the headline....the headline is the 1st thing visible in LinkedIn search results
- Definitely don't put just “Postdoctoral Associate” in your headline!

Sample LinkedIn Headlines

- Biochemical Engineer | Process Engineer | Project Manager
- Senior R&D Medical Device Engineer / Project Management / Material Specialist
- Chemist that loves projects that improve quality of life + inspiring future scientists
- Biomedical Scientist - Regenerative Medicine - R&D Consultant
- Postdoc at NC State. Interests: Electronic Textiles, Wearables, Flexible electronics, Soft robotics

LinkedIn About Section

- Allows you to talk more about yourself and the value you bring.
- While you have a 2,000 character limit here, **only the first 3 lines of your about section are shown by default** (without a visitor having to click to see more)
- **Thus, you have ~300 leading characters in your about section to grab someone's attention and make them want to read more . . . so make them count!**

Sample LinkedIn About Sections

- As a researcher in applied math and computer science, I design, implement, and evaluate algorithms for large-scale data mining and analytics, machine learning, graph theory, linear algebra, and scientific computing.
- I am an experienced molecular biologist, with a background in ecological genetics and forensic science. I am primarily interested in research and molecular diagnostic development.
- I am looking for a career that will allow me to further develop my analytic and programming techniques to solve problems, particularly those related to the modeling, optimization, and control of physical/biological systems.

Additional Sample LinkedIn About Sections

- **My passion is for emerging disruptive, instructive, sustainable and engaging technologies that can be leveraged to solve technical challenges and engage the public in science. I am an accomplished and energetic team leader, multitasker and problem solver. During my research career, smart, responsive materials, polymer engineering, nanoscale engineering, microfluidics, soft robotics, colloidal assembly and 3D printing were my main areas of interest and focus.**
- **I am a Research Economist for the United States Forest Service. My work examines the additionality of market interventions used to promote sustainable forest management and the socio-economic impacts on affected communities. Using tenets of behavioral economics coupled with agent based models, I examine the effects of market interventions on land-use change and wealth distribution.**
- **If my "day job" in drug development consulting is my Clark Kent identity, then my alter ego as Superman is my "side gig" as a career coach for STEM trained graduates. I've been growing my company, STEM Career Services, for the past 5 years and I love to share stories of my real world expertise in the workplace as a hiring manager with coaching clients and audiences across the country to help them bridge that often difficult gap from academia to nonacademic positions...**

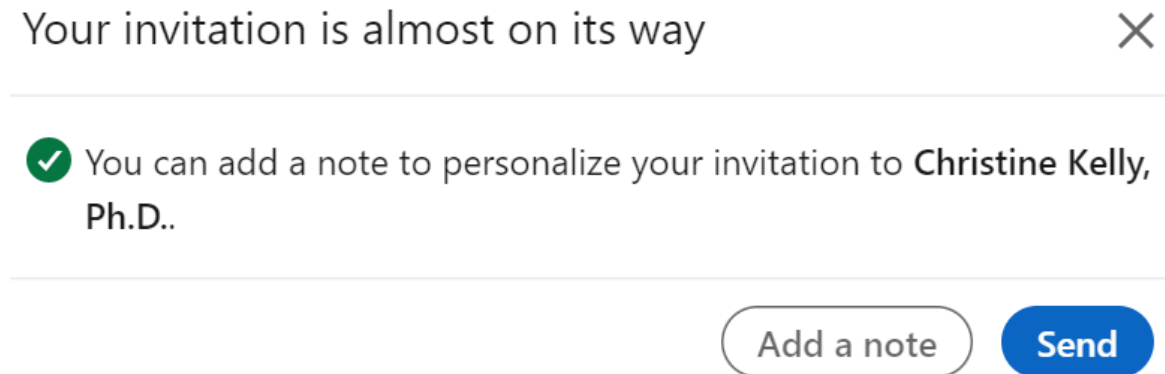

Connecting & Messaging on LinkedIn

- When requesting to connect with someone on LinkedIn, always add a message/note contextualizing why you are reaching out to connect. You have a 300 character limit in these messages. So keep it brief and to the point!
- The desktop-based site will allow you to add a note after hitting connect.
- When using the LinkedIn app, click on the “...” when on the individual’s profile and choose “Personalize invite” to access the note/message function when you send your connection request.



- **You can access a 1st degree connection’s email (if they provided one in the platform) from the “contact info” link at the top of their profile.**
- **If you are a member of a LinkedIn group, you can message anyone in the group without being connected with them prior! So, find relevant groups to join!!**
 - *This is a helpful feature even if you pay for LinkedIn Premium as you only have 5 InMail credits per month*

Informational Interviews & Career Exploration

Someone is out there living your future...

By talking with people in careers of potential interest, you get a window into a potential future for you.

Informational interviews allow you to, in a way, have a conversation with a future version of you.

- You can ask questions that matter to you about a career path and focus on your key values and interests.
 - Good work-life balance?
 - High level of autonomy?
 - Work from home?
 - Ability to grow and advance at the organization?
- Leverage LinkedIn Alumni Tool to identify potential contacts
